


To be by the side of more patients, enabling the delivery of outstanding critical care.

To provide outstanding critical care, by helicopter and car, day and night to the people of Lincs and Notts.


OUR VALUES

JOB SUMMARY

An opportunity has arisen for a Pre-hospital Emergency Medicine (PHEM) Fellow to join our expanding team at the Lincs and Notts Air Ambulance (LNAA) in August 2026.

The Fellowship will consist of 6 months of PHEM combined with 6 months working in the Major Trauma Anaesthesia Service at Queens Medical Centre in Nottingham. Candidates must be in ST6 or above in August 2026. It is considered as a 1 year post.

There is no training number attached to this post and it is expected that candidates will have sorted out OOPE / OOPT with their Training Programmes.

The HEMS doctor will be expected to:

- Participate fully within a clinical rota for pre-hospital operations on both platforms
- Carry out base duties eg medicines ordering, stock checking & equipment checks
- Maintain mandatory training and CPD
- Complete audit projects
- Participate in clinical governance programmes
- Attend D&D meetings, governance meetings and clinical training sessions
- Participate in base simulation exercises
- Maintain the HEMSbase database
- Follow up patients including those taken to other hospitals
- Develop and review clinical and non-clinical policies and guidelines
- Provide teaching for new doctors, Critical Care Paramedics, observers to the unit, medical students, & non-clinical members of staff.
- Undertake liaison activity outside the Unit with other agencies
- Support fund raising activities of the charity and attend events when required

JOB PURPOSE

You will provide clinical operational shifts (currently day 0700-1900, night 1900-0700 but subject to change) on either the helicopter or critical care car. You will also contribute to our service development and will engage in clinical governance activity under the direction of the Clinical Leadership Team.

Regardless of prior pre-hospital experience, every doctor will undergo an intensive period of induction period at LNAA which usually lasts 6-8 weeks.

This includes one-to-one base training, scenario-based teaching and simulation, and aviation training. The doctor will be required to complete a portfolio comprising clinical, aviation and operational competencies. Upon completion of the doctors competency document, a "sign-off" shift will be undertaken involving observation by a Senior PHEM Consultant. Successful completion of this is mandatory prior to embarking on solo operational duties with the team.

You will be joining a team of dedicated professional paramedics, pilots and doctors working at the top of their game and treating some of the most seriously ill and injured patients in some of the most challenging circumstances. We are looking for calm and collected individuals who will rapidly integrate into our team and embrace the clinical operational culture that has been developed at the organisation.

You can expect to be working at the cutting edge of prehospital medicine within a team that is always challenging itself to provide safe, effective, caring, and responsive care to our patients. Continuous self-reflection and seeking opportunities for development is part of our culture and you will be at the heart of these endeavours.

We have exciting times ahead of us. This is just the beginning.

Education and Qualifications

Essential

- Registered (or eligible to be registered) with the GMC with a licence to practise
- MBBS or equivalent medical qualification
- FRCA or alternative relevant post-graduate qualification
- Evidence of life support courses e.g. ATLS, ALS, APLS/EPLS.

Desirable

- Relevant PHEM related post-graduate qualifications : DipIMC / FIMCor DiMM
- Other courses relevant to Pre-hospital Emergency Medicine (PHEM) (eg) ATACC / PHTLS

Clinical Experience

Essential

- ST6+ in Anaesthesia by August 2026, including 6 months Emergency Medicine, or completion of ACCS:EM CT1-3

Desirable

- Current experience in Anaesthesia / Trauma Anaesthesia

Continuous Professional Development

Essential

- Evidence of participation in CME/CPD in the last 12 months

Research

Essential

- Ability to critically assess published research and incorporate it into clinical practice where appropriate
- Awareness of ethical issues
- Demonstrates understanding of the basic principles of audit, clinical risk management, evidence-based practice, patient safety and clinical quality improvement initiatives

PERSON SPECIFICATION

Desirable

- Demonstrates an understanding of research methodology
- Evidence of relevant academic and research achievements, and involvement in a formal research project
- Evidence of relevant academic publications
- Demonstrates an interest in and commitment to the specialty beyond the mandatory curriculum

- Experience of teaching medical students and junior doctors

Desirable

- To have the ability and willingness to teach at all levels and to all groups of staff

Clinical governance and audit

Essential

- Committed to and understands the principles of clinical governance
- Understands the principles outlined in the GMC document Good Medical Practice
- Understands the requirements of Medical Appraisal and Revalidation

Desirable

- Active involvement in a clinical governance programme
- Evidence of a portfolio of audit/quality improvement projects, including where the audit loop has been closed and there is evidence of learning of the principles of change management.

The applicant must demonstrate skills in listening, reading, writing and speaking the English language that enables effective communication about medical topics with patients and colleagues as set out in the GMC' good medical practice (2013).
